Matters plan to build a small sculpture garden in their city; and I'm grateful for the opportunity to have consulted on some of the design.

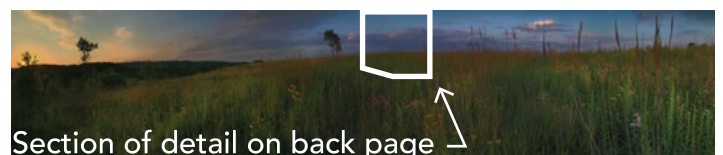
Part of our vision at WAC is to enhance the city of Waseca. We want to add beauty, color and a little bit of joy to our surroundings.
